K-9 expenses, with the exception of K-9 officer special stipend for care of the K-9, will come from this fund first. Any expenses beyond what is available in the fund will come from the Police Department operating budget. Revenues from police fundraising activities are deposited into this fund.
- Proposed Tourism expenditures as recommended by the DDA
